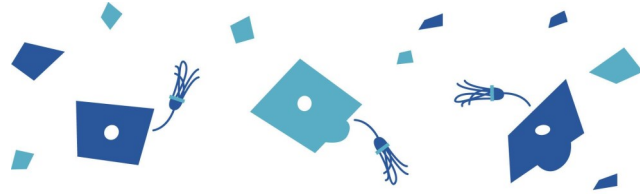
Stewardship Chair

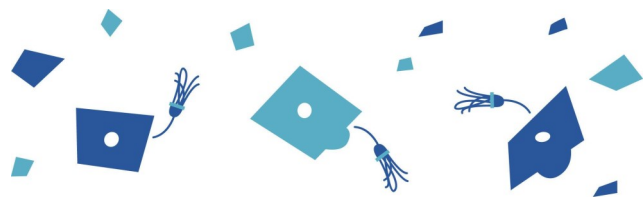
