Avoiding the Columbus Marathon ~ Next Sunday, October 15

- 315 Southbound: exit at Kinnear Road/ Olentangy River Road, turn left and follow Olentangy south to King Avenue, then right (east) on King to Northwest Boulevard, then left (south) on Northwest.
- 315 Northbound: take the exit for OSU Hospital, turn right on Cannon, and right on King Avenue to Northwest Boulevard.

Presbyterian Women (PW) in PSV Fall Gathering—Saturday, October 28

9:30 am to 3 pm.

All women are invited to come and join the Fall Gathering of PW at the Ramseyer Presbyterian Church, 3228 Westerville Road in Columbus. The theme will be "Walking in the Light", and will focus on mission in the church worldwide.

The mission project for this gathering will benefit school children. Ramseyer Presbyterian Church has asked that our "in-gathering" this month include supplies that kids of all ages need for school. Items suggested are: note books, pens, pencils, erasers, colored markers, file folders and crayons, pocket folders, assorted colors; Elmer's Glue sticks; box(es) of facial tissues, colored pencils, etc.



Why a Llama?

Llamas walk well on steep slopes helping families to carry loads. Families comb or shear their fur to produce up to ten pounds of fleece per year. This fleece is used to make ponchos and sweaters or sold to provide income for the family. They like to stay in a herd and can live up to 20 years.

Our mission drive for the month of October is Heifer International. Heifer International works with communities to end hunger and hardship by bringing sustainable agriculture and commerce opportunities to areas with a long history of poverty. The animals received from Heifer provide families with both food and a source of reliable income as products such as milk, eggs and honey can be traded or sold at market. When many families in an area gain this sustainable type of income, it brings new opportunities for building schools, creating agricultural cooperatives and funding small businesses. Since 1944, Heifer has provided these opportunities to resource-poor families in over 125 countries. The following is a list of the resources Heifer can provide and their cost:

Llama	\$150	Trio of Rabbits	\$ 60
Goat	\$120	Honeybee hive	\$ 30
Sheep	\$120	Flock of Chickens	\$ 20
