Mission Drive for October is Heifer International

Heifer works with communities to end hunger and hardship by bringing sustainable agriculture and commerce opportunities to areas with a long history of poverty. While there are many ways to help Heifer in their work, we are continuing to focus on providing animals to those in need. The animals these families receive from Heifer provide them with both food and a source of reliable income as products such as milk, eggs and honey can be traded or sold at market. Recipients are then required to pass on part of their gift to a neighbor in need. As many families in an area gain this sustainable type of income, it brings hope and new opportunities for their community.



Goat milk is rich in protein and makes tasty cheese and yogurt. A single goat can give up to a gallon of milk per day. Goats thrive on unproductive land and keeping a goat costs one sixth as much as keeping a cow.



Water Buffalo can plow a field or pull a heavy load with ease. Using a water buffalo to plow increases a field's output by four times more than if plowed by hand. They eat weeds and grasses in areas that might not support other livestock and provide 5% of the world's milk.



Llamas walk well on steep slopes helping families living in mountainous areas to carry loads. Families comb or shear their fur, and the fleece is used to make ponchos and sweaters or sold to others to provide income for the family. Llamas can live up to 20 years.

Personal care items are always requested by the clients at food pantries and are typically in very short supply there. These items are not covered by food assistance programs, and it is distressing to think that articles such as toilet paper or feminine hygiene products are considered luxuries in some households. As the Mission Committee continues to work with our partners in ways that they find to be the most useful, we hope that you purchase some of these items when

shopping for donation.

- 1. Toothbrushes for adults and children
 - (single brush rather than multi-pack)
- 2. Toothpaste
- 3. Disposable razors

- 4. Feminine hygiene products
- 5. Bars of soap (not body wash)
- 6. Toilet paper

Items can be dropped off in the Food Pantry Collection box in the Lounge. Sometimes more than food is required in order to have a healthy and decent lifestyle, and we can make a difference by helping to provide dignity to those in need. Any food items that are brought in will still be taken to and welcomed by the pantry.

Westside Free Store Ministries Clothing Collection for Fall and Winter

Boulevard is now collecting fall and winter clothing for the Westside Free Store. WFSM is a faithbased organization designed to share resources, build relationships, and create community on Columbus' west side. Since opening their doors in August 2004, they have become known as a hospitable community resource. Meals are served and guests may shop for clothes and small household items the three days a week they are open.

The Westside Free Store is always taking donations for gently used clothing and shoes for women, men and children, as well as small household items. Most needed right now are men's pants, blankets, and towels. New pillows and undergarments are always appreciated. Remember to donate clean clothing with all buttons, working zippers, and no stains. Called to Serve



The mats are 3' x 6' and are taken to NNEMAP for distribution. Each mat uses 500-700 bags, keeping a LOT of bags out of the landfill, and the little bits of the bags that are cut off can still be recycled!



There is a trash can/recycle bin in the Lounge for plastic bags to be donated to this mission. Please donate only "crinkly" grocery bags. Target, Kroger, Meijer, Giant Eagle, Dollar General, Walmart-all of these are good for mats. "Stretchy" plastic bags that are similar to trash bags or thick plastic bags like Arbys or Wendys can all be taken to the recycling bins at Giant Eagle.

Layette Project Helps New Parents in Our Community
