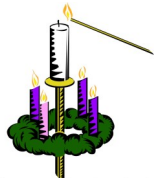
"The Wonder of Christmas" Book Study ~ through TODAY, December 19

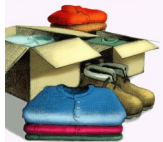
