### **Come! Let's Walk Together! ~ Faith Development: Sunday mornings at 11:00 a.m. in the Chapel**

This Lent, come, take a walk! Each Sunday, after worship, we will meet in the Chapel to talk and walk! Join Cyndi in discussing *The Walk* by Adam Hamilton. It is not necessary to read the book to participate!

How do we walk with Christ—daily follow him, grow in him, and faithfully serve him? Deepen your walk with Christ as we explore the five essential practices of worship, study, serving, giving, and bearing witness to our faith. These practices are rooted in Jesus' own walk with God. In the Gospels, Jesus modeled for us the Christian spiritual life. The apostles taught it in their writings. And the church has, through the last 2,000 years, sought to pursue this Christian spiritual life. Each of these practices are intended as part of our daily walk with Christ while also being an essential part of growing together in the church. In each chapter, Hamilton explores one of these practices, its New Testament foundation, and what it looks like to pursue this practice daily in our personal life and together in the life of the church.
