CHRISTMAS COMMUNITY CARE PACKAGES



The Mission Committee announces the kick-off of the annual Community Christmas Package Project! This project provides an opportunity for us to share the love of Christ with our neighbors in need during the Holiday season. Our goal this year is to reach 275 families. Please pray for God's guidance as we undertake this mission. As we only have 15-20 families this year who will need gifts, we will be doing the Christmas stars a little differently. We have allowed the children to request specific items. Their requests will be filled first from the toys we have on hand. If there are requests for items that we do not have, we will put up stars on the bulletin board to the chapel requesting those particular items for you to take should you wish.

We hope to have a container of cookies for each family, so get your ovens ready. Please watch for further information. We will set up shifts for Friday, December 17 and Saturday, December 18 (allowing limited numbers of people per shift) to assemble and fill boxes. If you feel comfortable with either of those activities, there will be sign-up opportunities soon. Limited delivery opportunities are available on Sunday, December 19. We urge you to partner with another person to make the deliveries (which will involve about 3 to 4 houses per team.) Again, if you are interested in delivering boxes, watch for sign-up opportunities in the near future.

THANK YOU FOR SUPPORTING ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING!

Mid-Ohio Workers Association (MWA) is an all-volunteer membership organizing drive of the working poor throughout Central Ohio. Active MWA members founded the Franklin County Workers Benefit Council in 2001. In response to the COVID-19 economic and public health crisis, members from the Franklin County Workers Benefit Council expanded Service Worker Advocacy Project (SWAP) to address inequities in official response to the pandemic. The Presbytery of Scioto Valley and the PC(USA) awarded Self Development of People (SDOP) grants to support SWAP's work to organize professionals to provide monthly medical education and information on COVID-19 and the COVID-19 vaccines together with vaccination sessions to reach the most vulnerable in low-income and minority neighborhoods. SDOP grants helped SWAP bridge the language divide between English and Spanish-speaking members by sponsoring the printing of membership benefit booklets in Spanish. The grants provided greater access to technology to conduct regular education sessions, on-line Zoom meetings during times of social distancing, translating quarterly membership newspapers into Spanish including a column called Our America featuring the stories of members from Central and South America. In 2021, SWAP mobilized speakers to testify at the state level to demand implementation the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development Goal #7 affordable, modern and sustainable energy for all. SWAP members successfully stopped \$110 million in utility rate increases. SDOP is funded by the One Great Hour of Sharing Offering.
