MEET MOVE TO PROSPER

The Mission Committee is excited to introduce you to MOVE TO PROSPER, our mission partner for the month of September.

MOVE TO PROSPER (MTP) was created to give Central Ohio low-wage families with children a chance to live in our region's higher-resourced neighborhoods. Their goal is to improve academic performance for the children and to improve financial well-being and physical and mental wellness for them and their families.

The three-year program empowers these families to gain economic security by making affordable rental housing available to them in safe neighborhoods with higher- resources schools. MOVE TO PROSPER equips families with the tools they need to flourish including:

- 3 years of rental support
- Workshops and programs monthly
- A life coach to support reaching financial, career, educational and wellness goals for the entire family
- Assistance integrating children into a new school and the family into a new neighborhood

The ten families in their pilot program thrived, raising their incomes by 58% or about \$17,000 on average, and the children were exposed to opportunities they would never have experienced in their old neighborhoods. They are now in the process of recruiting the first families into their growth initiative Empower 100 which will afford these opportunities to 100 new families.

Today we will be having a speaker from MOVE TO PROSPER who will share more about their life-changing program. We hope you will join us in learning more about MOVE TO PROSPER, seeing how MTP fits into our Matthew 25 initiative to eliminate systemic poverty and offering your financial support for their efforts.
