\*AFFIRMATION OF FAITH (based on The Confession of 1967, Part I: God's Work of Reconciliation)

- RIGHT PEWS: WE BELIEVE that in Jesus of Nazareth, true humanity was realized once for all. Jesus, a Palestinian Jew, lived among his own people and shared their needs, temptations, joys and sorrows. He expressed the love of God in word and deed and became a brother to all kinds of people.
