NOW HIRING: CHILD CARE PROVIDER!

We are still in need of volunteers to staff our Nursery during worship and the education hour. We are also seeking to hire an experienced childcare provider to provide continuity from week to week and give our regular volunteers a break. If you are interested in adding your name to the list of volunteers or know someone who would be interested in our childcare staff position, please contact Pastor Tiffany or Personnel Committee member Tim Harvey. All volunteers and staff must undergo a background check and be trained on our Child Safety Policy.

VBS AT BOULEVARD – TO BE or NOT TO BE

For many, many years Boulevard has hosted Vacation Bible School. Our program is well-loved by the children who come back year after year, is an effective way to reach out to our local community and gives Boulevard the opportunity to share God's love in both word and action. But VBS takes a lot of volunteers, and it cannot happen without you, the congregation.

The Mission & Faith Development Committees completely understand that, as a whole, our congregation is not getting any younger and that volunteering physically can get more challenging. We have already begun planning for this year's VBS and have quite a few positions filled, but we still need the following volunteers. Your response will help us understand if VBS is something the congregation still supports or if it is something that we are going to have to let go.

VBS is planned for Sunday July 7 through Wednesday July 10 from 5:30 to 8:00 for children entering kindergarten through 6th grade. Participation is capped at 60 children. Our message this year is Caring for God's Creation (or an iteration thereof).

DECORATIONS: Decorate the sanctuary—mainly the puppet stage with some other simple decorations at the doors. We have some supplies and will offer guidance.

SHEPHERDS: Six positions need to be filled. Shepherds are responsible for guiding their groups of children between rotation stations and lending assistance to the rotation leaders as needed (usually only in the crafts and science rotations). Shepherds need to arrive by 5:20 to meet their charges at their assigned church doors and then bring them down to dinner in Fellowship Hall at 5:30. Shepherds stay with the children during dinner and are welcome to enjoy the "gourmet fare" being served, bring their own dinner or eat at home before or after VBS. The children then go to an opening skit in the sanctuary followed by five 20-minute rotations. VBS ends at 8:00 with the exception of Wednesday when the children sing the songs they have learned to their families before going home. That wraps up by 8:15. While we would prefer to have shepherds do all four days, we could also do two-day shifts. Shepherds need to have taken the child care class and be background checked. SPRING POLLINATOR GARDEN NEWS

Recent research shows that a prairie sequesters as much carbon as a forest, area for area. Just another reason we are happy to have native prairie plants growing on our property! Just think, last year at this time the Native Plant Pollinator Garden site was just turf grass. Since then it's been prepped and planted and had a successful first season. And now, last year's plants are re-emerging! If you look you can see leaves growing around the old stems. That means the roots are established and the plants survived the winter. There are native bees developing in the old stems, so we will leave them in place for another month or so. This spring we will install an interpretive sign that explains to the community what native plants are and their place in the ecosystem. Any bare spots may be filled in with new plants if necessary. And there will be much less watering required, because these plants have evolved to live in our climate. Watch the garden for flowers, birds, caterpillars, bees, butterflies! We are showing our neighbors the beauty of God's creation and how to heal the earth.
