DRY BEAN SOUP MIX



Takes about 3 hours to make because beans need to soak and then cook gently.

Everything you need is included: 1. Dry beans 2. Spice packet 3. One can of tomatoes (stewed or diced)

SOUP RECIPE

- Step 1. Rinse all the beans with cold, running water. Inspect the beans and remove ones that are wrinkled or feel hard like small stones.
- Step 2. In a large cooking pot, add 9 cups of water and then the beans. Bring to a boil. Boil for 3 minutes. Remove the pot from the heat and let it set for 1 hour. Then drain the water and rinse the beans.
- Step 3.Place all the beans, 5 cups of water, and spices from the packet into the cooking pot.Heat to boiling then reduce heat to LOW and simmer gently for 1 ½ hours or untilBeans are tender. Stir the bean soup mix occasionally. Add more water if needed.
- Step 4. When the beans are tender, open the can of stewed or diced tomatoes and pour the tomatoes with liquid into the bean pot. Heat to boiling stirring the mixture. Reduce the heat to LOW and cook another 15 minutes. Stir the mixture as needed. Makes 6 7 servings.
